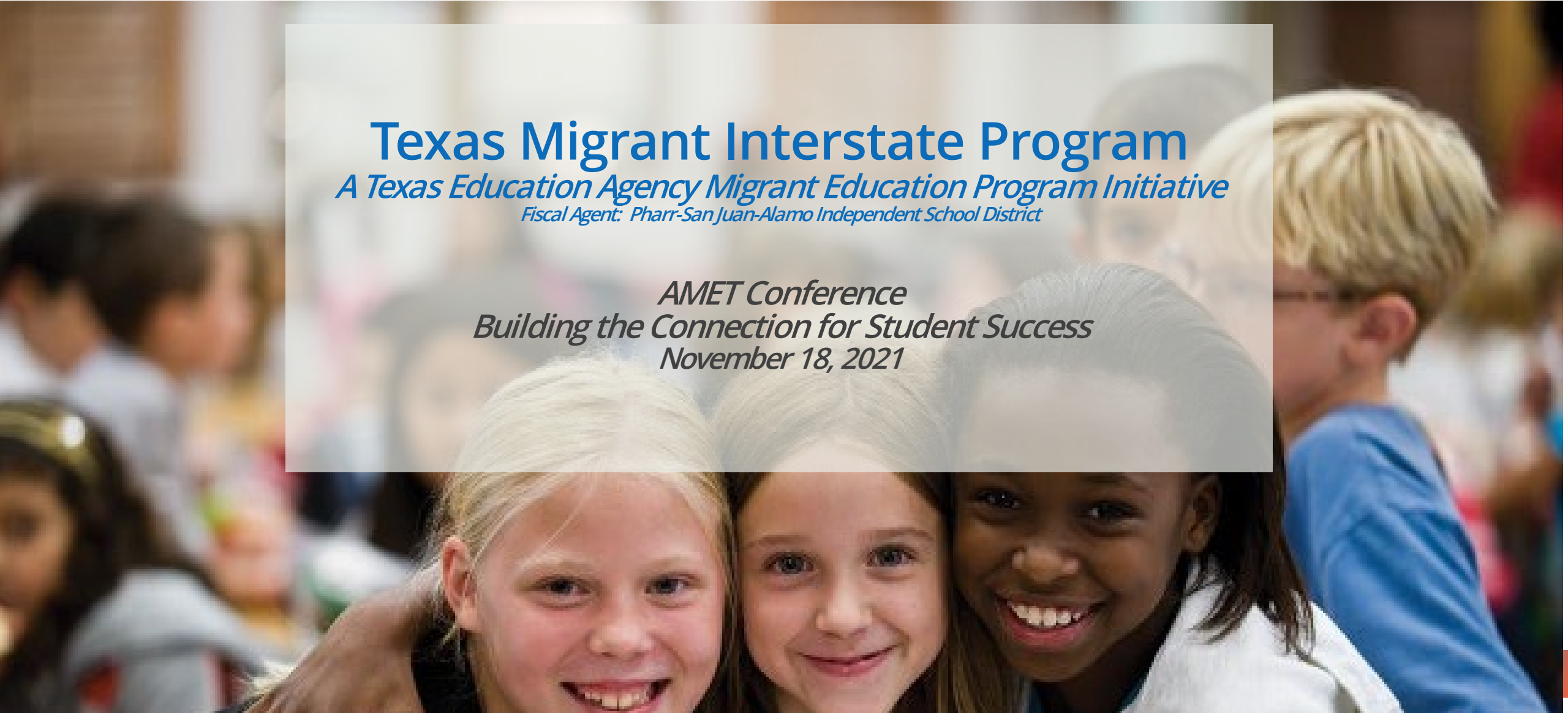

Effective Communications -Stakeholders

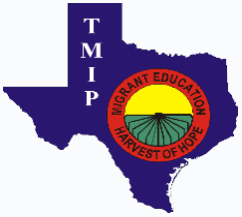

ROOTS, PREFIXES, AND SUFFIXES ⒸR

common roots: many English words have Latin, Greek, or other linguistic roots; these roots give clues about a word's meaning

Greek or Latin Root	English Word and Meaning
<i>therm</i> means <i>heat</i> ,	thermometer: tool used to measure the amount of heat in an object
<i>meter</i> means <i>measure</i>	

Prefixes and suffixes can change a word's meaning.

Word Part	Description
root	base, or main part, of a word
prefix	letters added before a root
suffix	letters added after a root

Example:

reelection

prefix root suffix

Prefix	Meaning	Examples
dis-	not, opposite	dishonor, displeasure, disarm
in-	not, opposite	inactive, insincere, injustice
im-	not, opposite	improper impossible immature
un-	not, opposite	unnecessary
non-	not, no	nonfiction, nontoxic, nonverbal

DICTIONARY, GLOSSARY, AND THESAURUS SKILLS ⒸR

dictionary: alphabetical list of words with meanings, syllables, pronunciations (how a word is spoken), and parts of speech

Part of Speech	Description	Examples
verb	an action word or state of being	run, was
noun	a person, place, thing, or idea	couch, boss
adjective	descriptive; describes a noun	red, fuzzy

Example: The following is a dictionary entry for *passage*.

passage *pas-ij* *noun* 1. road, route, or path 2. a short section of a written text or speech

glossary: alphabetical list of special words that are used in a book and their meanings; located at the end of the book

thesaurus: alphabetical list of words and their synonyms; can use to determine meaning or to help choose a different word

Example: Use the thesaurus entry below to replace *nice* in this sentence: The nice man gave Tomas a large slice of pizza.

nice *adjective* amiable, friendly, good, gracious, kind, pleasant

Answer: The friendly man gave Tomas a large slice of pizza.

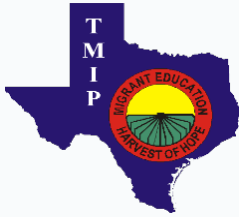

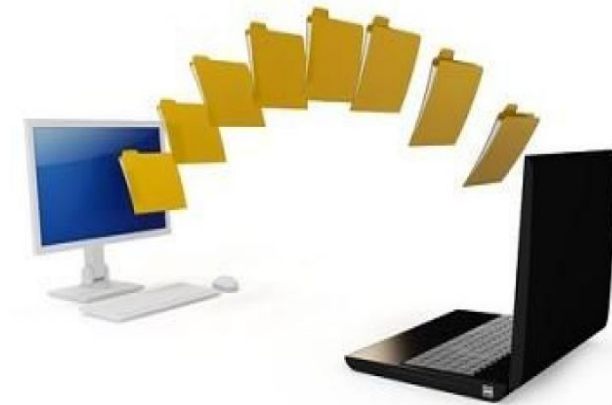

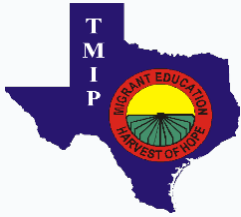
Exchange of Critical Student Information Intra/Interstate Coordination

5. We can use any method you are currently using to share critical student information should you choose not to use SharePoint.



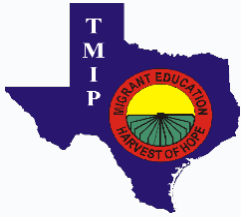

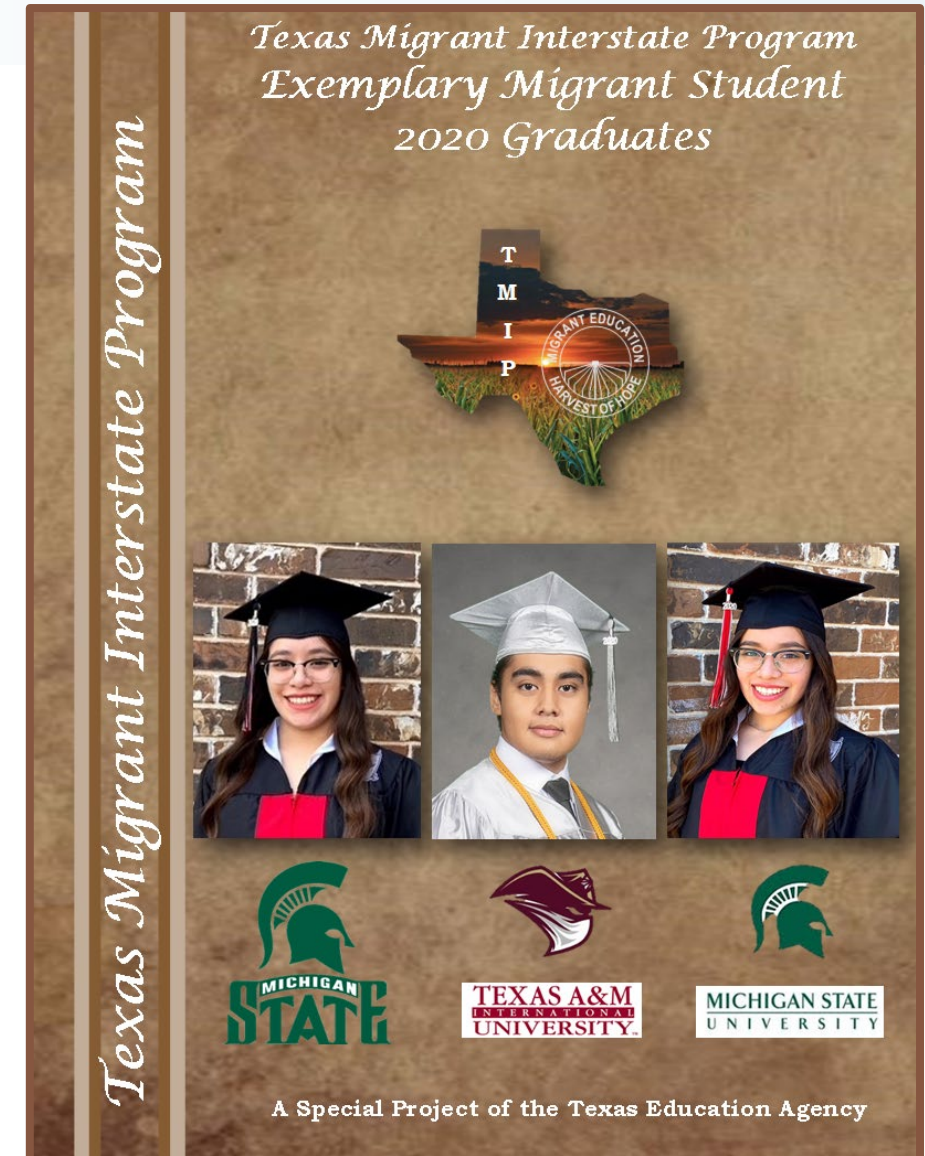


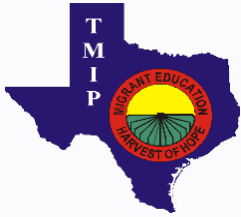
TMIP selects an individual that represents coordination, collaboration, and resourcefulness concerning our shared migratory students.

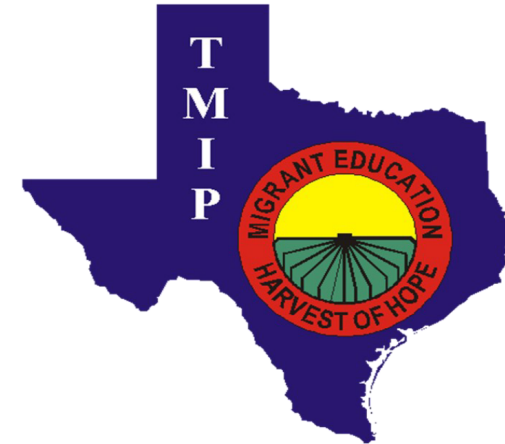
