

What is this resource?

A Bright Beginning is an <u>early literacy program</u> for three- and four-year old children in the Texas migrant education program.

What is the purpose of this resource?

The purpose of A Bright Beginning is to build early literacy skills of migratory children and to involve parents in the education of their children.



What are the components of this program?

All components are research-based and aligned to the *Texas Prekindergarten Guidelines*.

- 95 home-based lessons with parent involvement (English and Spanish)
- 95 center-based lessons with home, extended curricular, and center connections (English and Spanish)
- Formal and informal educator and program evaluation tools (English and Spanish)

How do migratory children participate in the program?

MEP staff in each school district

- identify and recruit migratory children, ages 3-5;
- determine which children are being served by a school-readiness program, such as pre-kindergarten or Head Start; and
- offer A Bright Beginning services to migratory children who are NOT being served by another school-readiness program.


Welcome to the K-12 Education Resources for Parents of Migratory Children.

The App is available for download to a tablet that the child has access to so he or she can play the games independently. Games on the app provide additional practice with the same reading and writing skills.









