A Bright Beginning

What is this resource?

A Bright Beginning is an early literacy program for three- and four-year old children in the Texas migrant education program.

What is the purpose of this resource?

The purpose of A Bright Beginning is to build early literacy skills of migratory children and to involve parents in the education of their children.



What are the components of this program?

All components are research-based and aligned to the *Texas Prekindergarten Guidelines*.

- 95 home-based lessons with parent involvement (English and Spanish)
- 95 center-based lessons with home, extended curricular, and center connections (English and Spanish)
- Formal and informal educator and program evaluation tools (English and Spanish)

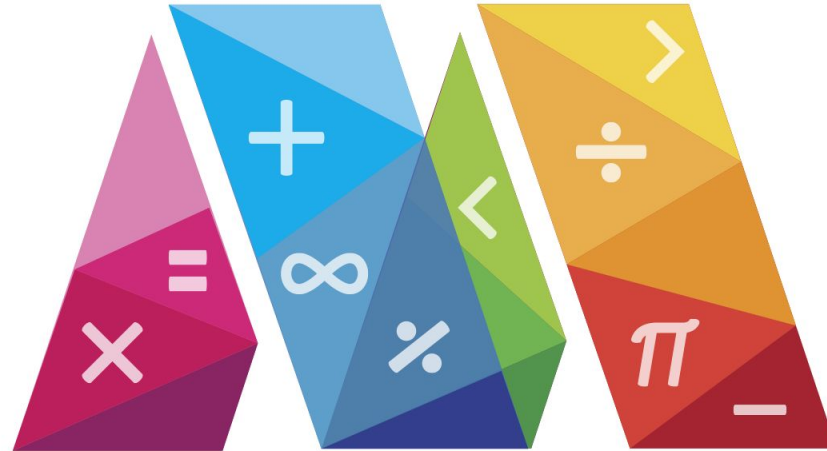
How do migratory children participate in the program?

MEP staff in each school district

- identify and recruit migratory children, ages 3-5;
- determine which children are being served by a school-readiness program, such as pre-kindergarten or Head Start; and
- offer A Bright Beginning services to migratory children who are NOT being served by another school-readiness program.

Project SMART is a Texas summer math program designed to strengthen the math skills of migrant students who have completed grades K-8.

What is the purpose of this resource?

The purpose of Project SMART is to improve the math skills of migratory children through research-based instruction.

- offer the Project SMART program to parents of children in the designated grade band(s)
